Change the <u>material</u>, change the <u>process</u> or change the <u>technology</u> to reduce emissions, water or waste at the source.

Don't put it into the pipe in the first place!







### Introduction to EJ

"Environmental justice" means the just treatment and meaningful involvement of all people, regardless of income, race, color, national origin, Tribal affiliation, or disability, in agency decision-making and other Federal activities that affect human health and the environment so that people:

- are fully protected from disproportionate and adverse human health and environmental effects (including risks) and hazards, including those related to climate change, the cumulative impacts of environmental and other burdens, and the legacy of racism or other structural or systemic barriers; and
- have equitable access to a healthy, sustainable, and resilient environment in which to live, play, work, learn, grow, worship, and engage in cultural and subsistence practices





### **PPI EJ events**

- PPI used EPA's EJ tools to identify communities and companies located in EJ (or adjacent to) EJ areas
- The goal is to start a dialogue with industry, Total population classified as disadvantaged: 99,665 (60.5%) community, and professionals in the field to create awareness and collaborative actions
- 2 industry speakers within the communities
- Community groups and organizations





Total population classified as disadvantaged: 147,901 (28.8%)




















#### **R7 EJ Community – Census Tracts Density Map**

- 29%, or 31 out of 105 counties have majority of their population residing in areas with EJ concerns












#### **EJ Community Vs Density of Population ----> Correlation**

### How is PPI assisting in EJ's Communities

- To help reduce the burden in these communities, PPI is targeting work at those areas classified as "disadvantaged".
- By minimizing the release of pollutants,P2 directly reduces the environmental and health burdens on communities, especially those historically impacted by industrial activities.
- Identify and assisting P2 practices through Technical Assistance
- Initiate educational training to small business development centers (SBDC's), college/Universities for potential solution to reduce the site-specific EJ burdens.

### **EPA's initiative**

Beginning with the Federal Fiscal Year 2024, the EPA has recently published its enforcement and compliance <u>initiatives</u> that will run through Federal Fiscal Year 2027. These initiatives can result in increased environmental inspections in your area.



The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has made a commitment to increase environmental inspections and strengthen enforcement to help advance the protection of communities that are vulnerable to or overburdened by pollution.

If you own a business in what is considered an environmentally overburdened, marginalized, or vulnerable community (also known as a community with Environmental Justice concerns) there may be an increase of federal environmental oversight in your
